The Sell Family Rolling Hills Percherons

In 1910, William Wesley Sell bought a 94 acre farm in Walkerrown NC In 1949, W. W. "Bill" Sell inherited 47 acres of this farm from his father's estate. Since that time, three more generations of "Percheron producing Sells" have been born on this same farm; Robert, his daughter, Robin, and son, Alvin, then came the grandchildren Jeremy and John. Until 1967, Bill ran a dairy and raised tobacco along with other crops including corn. grain, and hay. At the present time, along with the 47 acres, the Sells lease an additional 20 acres for farming. The main crops raised now are corn, oats, and alfalfa hay. They plant their corn, sow grain, cultivate corn, rake hay, and do some plowing with the Percherons. They have havrides, and at times, lease their Percherons to the city of Winston-Salem for several events that involve horses. At the present time, the family has twelve head of registered Percherons and have had as many as 19 at one time. They also keep a small herd of Hereford cattle on the farm.

The Sell Family is believed to have originated in England or Germany. The name Sell is associated with English and means, "dweller in the shelter for animals" or "in the headman's hut".

In 1938, Bill Sell bought his first Percherons, a pair of grade, grey marcs called Queen and Pat. He bought one marc from Frank Hilton, Walmur Gove, NG and the other from his brother Ellner. These two marcs worked very well, and this sparked a real interest in Percheron horses. Bill mised colts and worked Queen and Pat until they were 21 years old.

In 1972, the Sells bought their first registered Perchenos from Obed M. Yoder, Millersburg, Ohio, These gery mares, COMMANDERS QUEEN "KATIE" 251223 and COMMANDERS' LADY 251160 were full asserts, sired by FURY'S COMMANDER 250165, 19978 Can. Avin, at cweby vurst of age, won the hirch class (in a class of eleven) with these mares at the 1974 Daix Classic Earl, In 1977, Rolling Hills Percherons sold their first encides, as stud and filby, from them at the Eastern States Sale in Columbus, Ohio, they received 3 30000.00 for these two colts, which were both sired by PAT LA REX 250464.

Two more filles were bought in 1974; LA BON'S TOPSY 252067, from Harry Blair, Concord, NC and LA BELL'S TRICIA from H. E. Warne, Old Washington, Ohio. LA BELL'S TRICIA 252134 and CAS-SANDRA 'K' won first place in the Mare and Foal class at the 1983 Disie Classic Eric. LA BON'S TOPSY and her dughter, PATSY DECAS placed 2nd in the 2-ap Hirth in 1984 Discr Classic Fair, LA BELL'S TRICA has asiased a foal every year, this year will be her equiption.

In 1980, the Sell Family bought their

first Stallion, MAGICAL MISTY'S MIKE 254248, sired by JEREMIAH 252150, our of MAGICAL MISTY 250516, from Keith Hobden, Linsay, Ontario, Canada. "Mike" is the head sire ar Rolling Hills Farm.

and Grand Champion Percheron Stallion. "HECTOR" was sold to Daniel Hershberger of Dundee, Ohio in September, 1984.

At the Topeka Sale, in March of 1984, the Sells met John Pulver from Roanoke, Indiana. They bought four mares from Mr. Pulver; 10 DON FARM'S OSTRALIEN TOPSY 251396 and her three daughters. TOPSY'S LORENA 254188, TOPSY LINDA 255342 and TOPSY'S DAWN 257366, these mares were all sired by LEONET'S JASON 251901. With these mares, the Sells have had a successful '84 show season. TOPSY'S LORENA was 1st place aged Percheron Mare and Grand Champion Percheron Mare at the Dixie Classic Fair. She went on to the NC State Fair and won 1st place in the cart class. "DAWN" was 1st place 2 year old Percheron Mare at the Dixie Classic Fair. These three mares also won the Get of Sire for the Sells, and LORENA and LINDA won the Produce of Dam. At the Ohio State Fair, LORENA and LINDA stood in 6th place in the Produce of Dam class. The Sells have really grown to love these mares, and are thankful to John Pulver for affording them such an opportunity.

The Sell Family has registered 22 (dts), and they consider ROLLING HILLS PATTSY DEGAS 233958 to be the bast they have ever owned. PATSY was fooled April 7, 1978, she was sired by PAT LA REX 39464, and out of LA BONS TOPSY 23067, she new stands 17-1 and weights 23067, she new stands 17-1 and weights over at on. rectors for the NC Draft Horse & Mule Association for several years and had been President for the last six years. Robin has been Secretary/Treasurer of the association for the past two years.

The Sell Family sponsors a Dixie Draft Horse Sale Inc., there were 72 horses consigned at this years sale.

The StII Family has furnished Percherons for various 4-H judging contexts throughout NC. Robin has coached hei-4-H udging team-draft horse division for the past three years. She is a registered nurse and plays for thric thurch. Robin shushand, Jerry owns A & J Clanning Service, specialting in basines and decrose offeces,

Robert is employed by Gardens of Memory Perpetual Care Cemetary as aslesman. He serves on the deacon and usher board of their church. Robert's wife Trish, is a secretary for Gospel Light Christian School. She is very active in the church.

Bill is a life long farmer and at age 73 is still going strong. He is a very good carpenter, does iron work and about anything that needs doing. He is truly an inspiration to the whole family. Bill's wife, Mary, is retried from Sedge Garden Food Center. She does a lot of cooking, sewing and needle work.

Alvin graduated from Tennessee Temple University and has taught school for two years. He currently is in the Winston-Salem Police Academy. Alvin's wife, Kendell, is employed by Guilford Neurologic Associates as a sceretary. She became a new mother in November.

As a result of their Percherons, Robert says "We have made many friends from around the country, as well as, some in South America. We have enjoyed the many visitors the Percherons have brought us."
